





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As per Dr. Aniruddha Vyas, "it is a rare condition where the heart has extra electric conducting tissue leading to episodes of rapid lifethreatening heart rhythm."

The lady was admitted, underwent an EPS and RFA procedure, and was cured of this dreaded disease—that too without a single incision in her body.





Dr. Aniruddha Vyas says, "The procedure is done under local anaesthesia by venous access from the thighs, and the patient walks 4 hours after the procedure, cured of the disease.

Interestingly, this is one substrate of heart disease that has the potential for a permanent cure."
