19th & 20th September 2024

Jupiter Hospital Thane, in collaboration with the Society of Neuro Critical Care (SNCC), organized the second National Conference on Comprehensive Neuro Nursing Course (CN2C) on 19th and 20th September 2024. The event took place at Fortune Hotel, near Jupiter Hospital, and aimed to bring together nursing professionals, experts, and instructors to discuss advancements, challenges, and innovations in neurocritical care. A total of 85 candidates enrolled for the two-day event. Pre-tests and post-tests were conducted to assess baseline knowledge and effectiveness of the sessions. Delegates also earned Maharashtra Nursing Council credit points as part of their Continuous Professional Development (CPD).


The event concluded with appreciations and a vote of thanks.




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PRE AND POST -TEST ANALYSIS



SIMULATION BASED WORKSTATIONS

Station 1: BLS and ACLS The team of ACLS instructors, Dr. Jitpal Kaur Vig, Dr. Monika Singh, and Ms. Marina Pinto, focused on teaching and demonstrating the fundamental skills needed to respond to cardiac emergencies. The training covered CPR, stroke identification, and choking management. Each participant performed a redemonstration to ensure the effectiveness of the training.



Station 2: Neurological Assessment The neurological assessment workstation facilitated comprehensive evaluations of a patient's nervous system using models and live demonstrations performed on each other. Led by Nurse Educators Ms. Sujatha Kakarla and Ms. Prajakta More. The session served as a refresher training. It provided a standardized, efficient, and thorough approach to neuro assessments, making the concepts clearer for all attendees.





SIMULATION BASED WORKSTATIONS

Station 3: Airway Management Ms. Karleena Thomas, Nurse Educator, and Ms. Sunitha V.S, Nurse Manager, provided a comprehensive explanation of the workstation, covering both basic and advanced modalities as well as specialized techniques for airway management. They discussed topics such as airway assessment, medications used for intubation, and best practices for tracheostomy care. The session was innovative and captured the interest of many attendees.



Station 4: Drains, Lines, and Tubes used in Neuro ICU Ms. Rani Santosh and Ms. Lincy Sebastian, Nurse Managers, provided an in-depth session on invasive lines specific to neuro ICUs. They covered topics such as extra ventricular drains, ICP monitoring, CVP monitoring, and arterial and central line care, using both a mannequin and a simulator monitor. This session sparked significant interest among the participants, leading to numerous thought-provoking questions, which were expertly addressed by Dr. Sanjay Walke, ICU Consultant.



CONCLUSION

The second National Conference on Comprehensive Neuro Nursing Course (CN2C) was a resounding success, providing a vibrant platform for nursing professionals to enhance their knowledge and skills in neurocritical care.
